Founded in June 2024, Red Tent Fund is a national nonprofit organization, rooted in the Jewish values and teachings that affirm the right to abortion for all, that funds lawful abortions across the United States.

We believe all individuals, regardless of religion, political affiliation, income, or other factors, have a right to make their own reproductive health decisions with dignity and without barriers. We are fueled by Jewish laws and teachings that affirm the right to abortion for all, and by the concept of *tikkun olam*, our collective duty to repair the world. These foundations affirm our unwavering commitment to protect human dignity and behave with compassion. Through partnerships with, and direct funding to, independent abortion clinics, we remove financial barriers to care – one patient at a time.

In 2025, our first full year of operations, we reached a historic milestone: providing support to our 1,000th patient. ***And we didn't stop there.***



A LETTER FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR & BOARD CHAIR

Dear Friends,

When we launched Red Tent Fund in June 2024, we knew the need was urgent: only nine states and Washington D.C. had no restrictions on abortion care. Chaos in state courts meant patients were confused about their options to access care, which could change from hour to hour. Abortion bans caused interstate travel for abortion care to double since 2020.

As we look back at the time since our launch and especially at 2025, we can't help but reflect: patient needs were many and urgent, but our community's response rose to meet these needs. In 2025, Red Tent Fund provided over \$500,000 in direct support to 17 independent abortion clinics across the country. In turn, these clinics relayed Red Tent Fund resources to support more than 1,400 patients from 41 states and territories. In addition, we built a growing network of more than 50 congregational partners. These partnerships demonstrate how important reproductive health and abortion access are to our Jewish community.

Our block grant model of providing funding through partner clinics meets patients at the point of care: at their clinic appointment, when they need funding. We provide clinics with consistent, upfront resources – helping to minimize wait times, reduce uncertainty, and streamline administrative work for patients and clinic staff. This approach ensures immediate access to care while building sustainable partnerships across the abortion funding landscape.

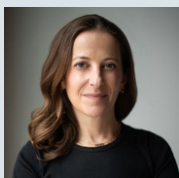
As we look ahead, restrictions on abortion access show no signs of easing. But we also see a community that refuses to abandon people seeking care: clinic staff who work tirelessly, donors who understand that reproductive freedom is inseparable from human dignity, and congregations that prove faith communities can be powerful advocates for bodily autonomy.

In 2026, Red Tent Fund will add new clinic partnerships, grow our congregational network to 100 communities nationwide, and increase patient funding to \$750,000. And none of this work happens without you. Every dollar you give directly supports someone's abortion care.

As we celebrate supporting over 1,400 patients, we are reminded that behind each number is a person with a story and reasons for seeking care. These patients deserve our respect, our support, and our commitment to a future where geography and finances don't determine who can access abortion care.

Thank you for making 2025 a year of impact, dignity, and hope, and here's to everything we can accomplish together in 2026.

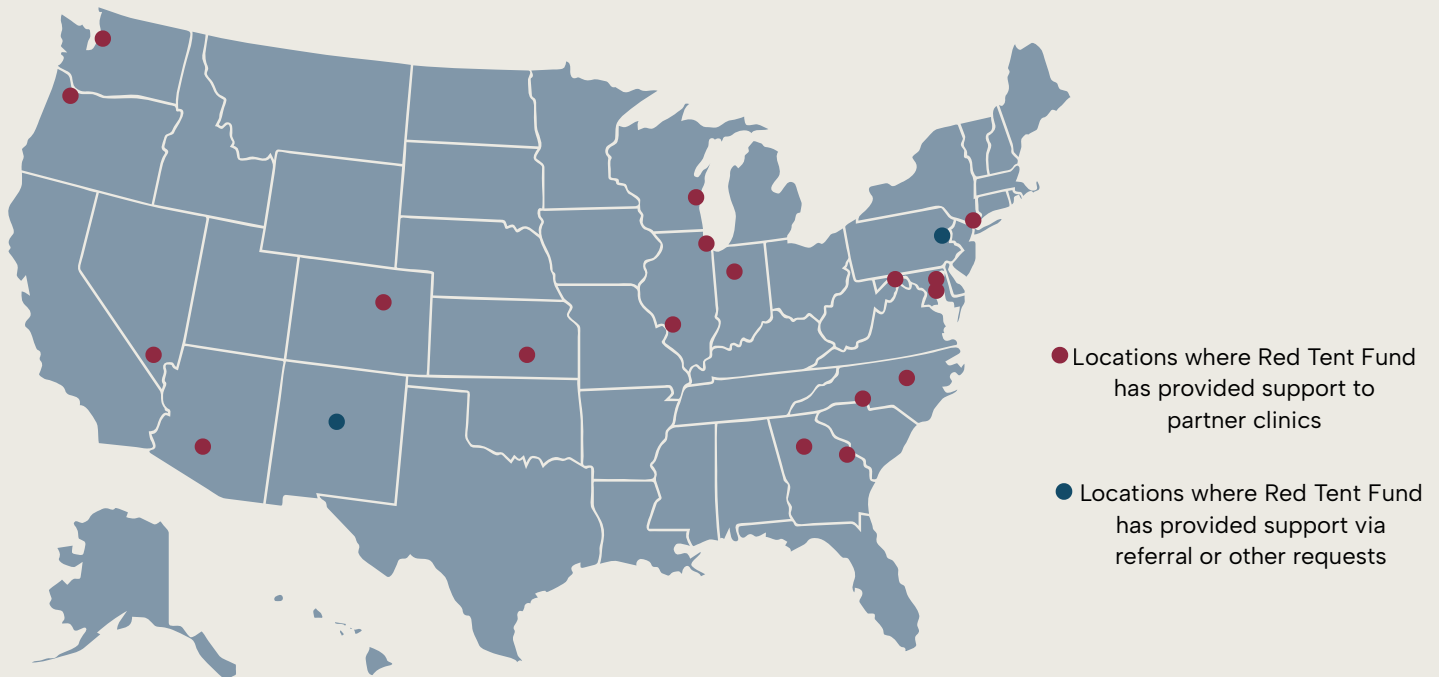

Our Model:

Each month Red Tent Fund provides block grants directly to independent abortion clinic partners across the country. This enables clinic staff – who already have trusted relationships with patients – to offer immediate financial support at the point of care. Informed by our field experience and input from clinic partners, this approach ensures efficient support and reduces barriers for patients who are already under considerable stress. We also respond to individual referrals and funding requests as our budget allows.

In 2025, we supported patients at **17 partner block grant clinics** and assisted patients at **two additional clinics** who were short on funding.



Why independent clinics?

Independent abortion clinics provide the majority of abortion care and are often the only providers in their regions. By partnering with independent clinics, we ensure our support reaches those who need it most.



Most patients we serve must cobble together funding from multiple sources just to access care. Red Tent Fund's support is often the difference between receiving care immediately or having to wait and pay more.

Our model is built on trust: we provide block grants directly to clinics, empowering providers who know their patients best to allocate support as they see fit. This eliminates the stress of patients calling multiple abortion funds. Clinics get compensated for the services they provide in real time – critical for independent providers operating on tight margins. And it gives clinic staff flexibility to respond to changing patient needs.

About half of the patients we've helped received Red Tent Fund support as their sole source of financial assistance, or as their only support alongside one other national funder. This efficiency matters—dollars reach patients quickly, with less bureaucracy at a time when every obstacle matters.

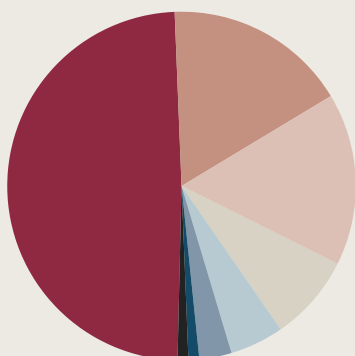
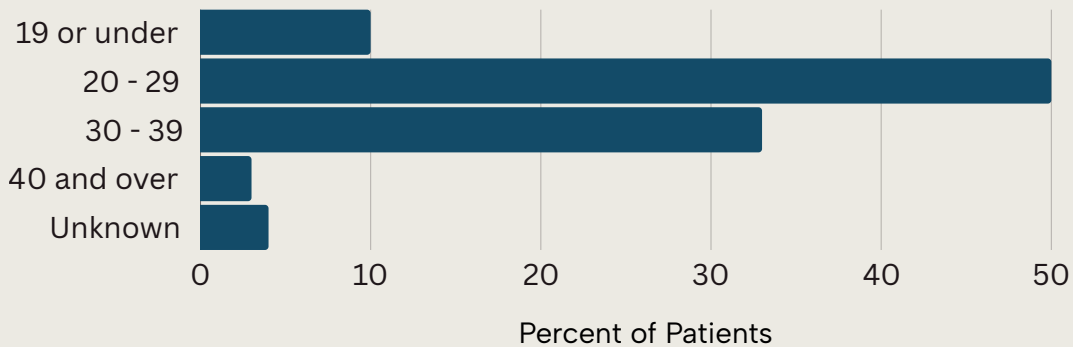

Demographics by Age

The ages of patients who are supported by Red Tent Fund align with national data, with approximately 10% under the age of 20 and the vast majority – 83% – in their 20s and 30s.

Red Tent Fund block grant funds are allocated by our clinic partners to patients who need financial support, with demographics reflecting national abortion care patterns. These numbers underscore how communities facing the greatest systemic barriers to healthcare are most impacted when abortion access is restricted.



Financial Barriers

Just over half of patients Red Tent Fund (RTF) serves live at or below the federal poverty level (FPL) and many more struggle to afford basic needs despite earning slightly more than these thresholds. This prevalence of patients at or below FPL aligns with national trends identified in Dr. Diana Greene Foster’s “Turnaway Study,” which found that abortion does not harm women’s health and wellbeing; rather, being denied an abortion leads to worse financial, health, and family outcomes. These include higher poverty rates, increased unemployment, diminished physical health, and increased risk of staying with abusive partners and mental health distress, such as anxiety.

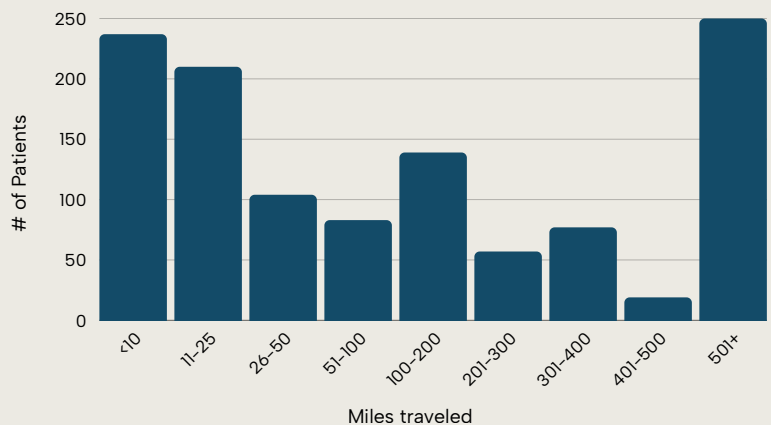
